

Re-PoWER

The Restoration Project of Winterization and Energy Resources: recovery of the electricity supply, protection facilities for sub-stations, and emergency equipment for the heating services



RELINC

The Repairing Essential Logistics and Network Connectivity: repairs for restoration of critical transport connectivity and provision of rail rolling stock and Danube ports equipment to expand Ukraine's export capacity



HOPE

The Housing Repair for People's Empowerment project: critical repair needs of the country's partially damaged housing stock. The project aims to benefit more than 100,000 families.



ARISE

The Agriculture Recovery Inclusive Support Emergency project: recovery of agricultural production affected by the war through provision of access to affordable financing for farmers and grant support to small farms.



HOUSING

- Most affected sector with total damage of over US\$55 bn
- 2 million residential units (~10% of total residential stock) impacted affecting ~5.5 million residents
- Over 3.7 million people displaced within Ukraine only (as of Dec 31, 2023)
- ~87% of housing units damaged are in multi-family apartment buildings
- 4 out 5 damaged units are in urban areas
- Over US\$80 bn required for recovery



HOPE: RESPONSE TO NEEDS AND RESULTS

The Housing Repair for People's Empowerment project (P181200): critical repair needs of the country's partially damaged housing stock. The project aims to benefit more than 100,000 families.

Remaining Funding Gap: \$575.5 million

Results:

- Over 82,000 applications
- 50,000 households compensated (>130,000 people)
- Additional US\$120 mn to be paid by end of 2024
- Third Party Monitoring Agency ToR mobilization underway onboarding by fall 2024
- City Eligibility and Building Selection Criteria finalized

HOPE: EXPECTED PROCUREMENT

Preparation of detailed design documentation for rehabilitation/restoration of multi-family buildings with partial/medium damages.	Cumulative of USD 12 million	August-October 2024

- The list of participating municipalities shall become available in early July 2024
- The call for designs are expected to be launched by the municipalities in late summer or early fall 2024

AGRICULTURE AND FOOD PROCESSING SECTOR

- Total cost (damage and loss) in agriculture sector estimated at US\$80 billion
 - 20% decrease in planting area
 - 10% decrease in livestock herds
 - Direct employment drop by 18%
- 3.4 million people in need of food security and livelihoods support
- Access to finance identified as most crucial issue for farmers, from small to large, to continue producing food for local and global food security

No procurement

Results:

- Over 10,000 farmers received affordable financing
- Over \$1 bn in financing (private capital mobilization) for agricultural production in 2023
- Contribution to increase in production of major grains and oilseeds in 2023
- Over 50,000 more farms and 40,000 small farms to benefit in 2024



TRANSPORT SECTOR

- Over third of territory affected, including critical corridors for imports and exports Damage to Transport assets of US\$34 billion two years after the war (as of Dec 2023): 8,400 km of roads
- - 390 bridges
 - over 50 km of rail lines
 - 83 railway bridges
- Logistics chains & maritime ports disrupted due to shutdown of BSGI in July 2023
 2024-33 needs of US\$74 bn (57% roads, 73% in Donetska, Khersonska, Zaporizka, Kharkivska, and Luhanska oblasts)
 Continuous strikes on port infrastructure in Odeeke and Markivska ablests
- Odeska and Mykolaivska oblasts, including on Danube River ports
- Solidarity lanes hampered by slow border procedures and Ukrainian agri import restrictions in some EU countries

Results:

- Modular bridges needs met fully by donors/IFIs
- 18 modular road bridges delivered (400 meters)
- Equipment for rail repairs 1st batch delivered, rest by July
- Flatbed wagons delivery of 100 in May and 100 by August



Remaining Funding Gap: \$310 million

ENERGY SECTOR

- Over 50 % of Energy Facilities damaged
- Strikes in March-April 2024 largest one-off damage
- Over 7 GW of generation capacity lost since March
- Generation facilities and electricity transmission systems in Kharkiv, Zaporizhzhia, Lviv, and Kyiv regions
- Dnipro hydro power plant out of operation
- 19 substations attacked, 8 destroyed, 6 HV transformers heavily damaged
- □ 1.1 mn consumers disconnected (affecting 2.5 mn pple)
- □ Kharkiv in blackout: 700,000 consumers cut off (affecting over 1.5 mn people)
- Heroic continued restoration of service by Ukrainian energy companies



APRIL 11TH ATTACKS: MORE DAMAGES



- Tripilska Thermal Power Plant (TPP) completely destroyed in April 11th attacks on - important for supplying Kyiv and regions nearby
- □ The state holding of TPPs lost 100% of its generation capacities
- Privately-owned DTEK lost 80% of its generation capacities
- Attempts to attack Ukrenergo's, Ukrhydro's and Naftogaz's facilities continue
- District heating-related cogeneration facilities are attacked as well

Remaining Funding Gap: \$253 million

Results:

- 14 units of 750kV Phase Shift Transformers contracted – delivery Feb 2025
- Implementation Support Consultant mobilized
- 6 Autotransformers under procurement delivery April 2025
- Additional 13 Autotransformers under procurement delivery April 2025
- Special machineries/vehicles under procurement- by November 2024
- Protective facilities added
- Funds mobilized for 97 autotransformers 19 delivered
